## MUST WE CHOOSE BETWEEN FREEDOM AND INTIMACY?

The burgeoning technology and sociocultural revolution/liberation of the last decade has left most of us freer than ever before, as individuals, to chart the course of our lives. But at what cost? The health—and possibly the survival—of our society could depend on the answer.
